## Primary Goal Statement for Fiesta Island from the "1994 Mission Bay Park Master Plan"

Open space for all users

Keep the water clean

Opening under entry for water flow and One-way road

This is the only place to launch model rockets

**Fiesta Island should be an area that supports a diversity of regional-serving public and non-profit recreation and natural resource management and enhancement uses.**

No hotels, condo No multi stay bldg. No developers

Keep the dog park and ability for horse riding.

Where is beach access for the dogs?

Recreational upgrade

Secondary Goals for Fiesta Island from the "1994 Mission Bay Park Master Plan" suggest that Fiesta Island should be:

1) An Island whose east side provides for citywide and regional serving passive recreation uses, forming a unit with North Pacific Passage and the East Shores area of the Park.

2) An Island whose west side focuses on the wide beach and its relationship to the water uses of Fiesta Bay, allowing for informal public use of the beach and permitting temporary use as a controlled access special-event viewing area.

Keep it natural and a quiet reserve.

No Hotels

3) An Island where the landscape design of the east and west sides respects their significance in terms of defining the Park's image to passing and through traffic as well as to Park users.

4) An Island which provides for the operation of special events both on land and on adjacent water bodies.

Bad idea!! Swimmer and watercraft need to be kept separate--- safety first.

Only if it does not interfere with public access (free)

5) An Island whose southern side provides for public recreational uses complementary to the water use in South Pacific Passage and Hidden Anchorage and the land use at the South Shores area of the Park.

Land development for rec. use @ hidden anch. would mix swimmers and boats.

6) An Island which includes a substantial new resource enhancement area, located to the southwest facing across the water to Sea World, displacing the current sludge drying beds (note: this goal was superceded by the proposed land use plan for the Island).

#6- Resources balanced with off-leash majority to dog

Keep hidden anchorage as permit only ski area.

USD ski team needs a place to practice.

7) An Island which provides for bicycles, other non-motorized forms of circulation, pedestrian circulation and connection to other park areas.

#6 is bad-- Sounds like an expansion or enhancement for Sea World.

8) An Island on which pedestrian and other non-motorized circulation is prioritized over automobile circulation.

If you build parking lots this goal cannot be met

I like 8 because that's how it is now.

Only improve the road.

9) An Island on which special emphasis is placed on using natural landscapes within recreation areas.

Support good #2,3,4,7 especially 8,9, and 10

#9- Natural so long as 'natural' is not wildlife agency preserve

Leave space so everyone can access it No fees/hotel

10) An Island on which the land is graded to increase the area with strong visual connection to the water.

Grading is a term I don't trust. Grade to whose standards?

Multi-use is good for all

11) An Island which the access bridge(s) and/or causeway(s) form an appropriate gateway and aesthetic statement.

One access to island Not Many
